




If you are a Libby user, look for some changes to how you manage e-book or audiobook holds. If you have an e-book or audiobook on hold and it becomes available before you are ready to read it, you can choose to "Suspend" the hold. When you are ready to read the book, you will simply "Unsuspend" the hold. You will no longer see the "Deliver Later" option. Expect to see this change in mid-September!

Another great way to keep track of books you want to read is by using Tags in Libby. Find the title, tap the tag icon, create a new tag and name it (To Be Read or TBR, for example), and tap "Create." You've created a tag and tagged a title. You can find your tags by tapping the tag icon in the footer.




Release Date: September 30, 2025





### **Early Literacy Corner**

You can promote early literacy through easy, everyday activities. Here are some ideas! It's more than reading.

Songs--Play musical hide-and-seek. Play music on your phone and hide it in your play area. Have your child find the phone.

Math--Mix up pairs of colorful socks and ask your child to match them.

Rhymes--Fill a basket with household items. Say a word, real or made-up, that rhymes with one of the items and have your child pick the right match.

Sounds--Put leaves or acorns in a bucket. Ask your child what sounds she can make with them. Can they be drummed, swirled, crunched, etc.?

Stories--September 7 is Grandparents Day. Pick a meal that reminds you of your grandparents. Tell your child the story of why you love this meal.

Science--September 15 is National Play Doh Day. Help your child press leaves against rolled out play doh. Pull the leaves away to reveal detailed imprints.

Play--Play chef with your child. Give him a stainless steel bowl and wooden spoon to "make a meal" as you're making one.
