

2025 Fund Drive









Early Literacy Corner

You can promote early literacy through easy, everyday activities. Here are some ideas! It's more than reading.

Math--November 3 is Sandwich Day. Practice fractions by cutting a homemade sandwich in half, then in quarters.

Stories--November 4 is Election Day. Ask your child what she would do if she was elected president of the United States of America.

Science--November 8 is STEAM Day. Create a simple marble maze using paper plates, construction paper, and tape. Or, sign out our Marble Run from the Library of Things!

Play--November 11 is Origami Day. Encourage your child to pick out a simple origami design and create it together.

Songs--Sing "Five Little Turkeys" with your child and keep count of each turkey on your fingers.

Writing--Spell out different words using beads, beans, pasta, etc.

Rhymes--November 27 is Thanksgiving. Ask your child to name as many words as he can think of that rhyme with "pie."
